There were 32 entrants in the show with another 9 cars choosing to display only. It was very exciting to see the 928's arrive en masse (seven in all). Yes, we had another Shark Attack. These are great cars and obviously much loved by their owners as shown by their well worn seats. Among the 928 owners was recent transfer from Texas (Maverick Region) to New Hampshire, Ernest Swersky. We look forward to seeing him at other NCR events soon. We also gained a new member at the event, Mark Macone from Hollis, NH, with a 1980 911SC Targa he is restoring.

There was also a Picnic Contest this year with awards for Most Traditional, Most Elegant and Best Food. Trophies for these categories were fantastic: an elegant picnic basket, champagne (specially bottled by Francis Ford Coppola and called Sofia) and crystal glasses, and a basket of fine foods and snacks from



Trader Joe's. Trophies the People's for Choice classes and the Mystery Judged class were selected wines (Turnbull, 2005 Old Bull Red for First and 2005 Place Sauvignon Blanc for Second and on). The wines were recommended by the Wine Cellar in Nashua, NH as good summer wines.

The event benefited the NH Food Bank. Mark Jesionowski

was on hand from the Food Bank to answer people's questions and accept food or cash donations. Net proceeds from the Show will be donated by the club to the NH Food Bank and are estimated to be approximately \$1500.

charitable work. We hope to return to the site next year and hope more of you will come out, bring your picnic and enjoy the day.

# **AUTOCROSS ROUND THREE**

After being forced to cancel our second autocross due to heavy rains and flooding, we were rewarded with beautiful weather for Autocross #3. The Devens skies were sunny with temperatures in the low 80s.

The gate was opened late delaying the start of the event. First car off was about 10:00 a.m. but everything ran smoothly once we started. So we decided to try FIVE morning runs. This proved to be too many runs, especially for the two-driver cars, with many tires, cars and drivers getting overheated. We settled for four afternoon runs giving everyone nine runs for the day. We still finished early.

The course was designed by a national expert in course design and presented a lot of technical elements making it very challenging. Most drivers enjoyed the course even though they had trouble with parts of it. Most of the negative comments had to do with the sections where we were forced to use the brakes. However, threshold braking is a skill most of us need to work on.

We had a close battles in Classes 1 and 2. Sigrid Schnoerr held the early class 1 lead, but Mark Schnoerr and Chris Darminio both turned in smoking last runs with Mark edging Chris out by a quarter of a second for the trophy.
