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


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On the cover

My mom and dad took my sister and me to Gettysburg when I was in 3rd grade for the first time and I was instantly hooked on Civil War history, especially Gettysburg.

With the holiday season behind us, we find ourselves now settling into the gloomy days of winter. With the countdown to spring firmly underway, I certainly have time to reflect back upon the Christmas holiday. Jaime's family takes Christmas very seriously, and I always have a wonderful time with them as we play games, eat, drink and be merry. This year was a little different for me as Christmas night I flew down to Washington DC to visit my sister Janet, her husband Randy and my 7 month old niece Kate. My mom and dad flew up from Estero, Florida, as this was Kate's first Christmas. Sadly, Jaime couldn't make it for this trip as she coaches and had a track meet the next day.

I got down there in time to see Kate before she went to bed; we opened her gifts before she retired for the night. I have already priced out a 4-stroke, 30mph go kart for her that she will have when she is two years old, but until then, she gets a stuffed animal from me. I gave Randy his own NCR-PCA membership to finalize his acceptance into the Gratton family with the goal of him taking part in his first DE event this year at NHMS. After a long day I was more than happy to crawl into the good ol' pull-out sofa bed, even with the bar in my back and Janet's Pit bull Rosie sleeping in the middle, I was out like a light.

Before sunrise the next morning my dad and I slumped into Randy and Janet's red Miata with coffee in hand. We were on a mission that we had planned long before arriving in DC. We were determined to be the first guest at the Gettysburg National Battlefield Visitor Center when it opened at seven in the morning. My mom and dad took my sister and me to Gettysburg when I was in 3rd grade for the first time and I was instantly hooked on Civil War history, especially Gettysburg. This particular would be my 11th such trip to Gettysburg and my dad's first since the recent opening of their new visitor center. Our plan was to tour the center, do a CD car tour of the battlefield and then study a few parts of the battlefield with an advanced battlefield book that broke down each engagement in greater detail.

Upon arriving at the visitor center, we were easily the first in the building and being the day after Christmas we had this massive

new building all to ourselves. After watching a 20 minute video narrated by Morgan Freeman we toured the portion of the center that explained the entire Civil War leading up to Gettysburg, during the battle and following the battle. I am always amazed at the numbers of men who gave their lives to fight against brothers, friends and countrymen. At Gettysburg, 46,000-51,000 men were killed in three days of fighting. This would be the equivalent of a large sports stadium being wiped out in three days. Incredible, simply incredible!

Following the tour of the center, my dad and I purchased a CD and tour book that you played in your car and when you reached certain stops gave detailed information of what happened at that point. Being true enthusiasts, my dad and I put the top down on the Miata to really get into the tour. It was a gorgeous 45 degree day, with no wind or clouds. I am sure we looked rather peculiar driving around in a little red Miata with the top down on December 26th. Both being over six feet, my Dad and I don't fit in the car well, but it is still a hoot to drive.

There was one point on the battlefield that I really wanted to visit and tour with my advanced guide book, titled *Gettysburg:* A Battlefield Guide by Mark Grimsley and Brooks D. Simpson. The Wheat Field was one of the deadliest engagements of the war where 7,000 men died in a few hours. My book had you walk to certain portions of the field and described in detail what I would have seen, heard and felt had I really been there. Unlike the car audio tour, this book really got you to stand on the exact spots out and about on the field. As most of the trees, rocks, stonewalls and hills are still accurate, you are really able to get a good feeling for what happened back in July 1863.

The trip was a whirlwind for my dad and I, but we really wanted to make it a point to get up there. Our main objective of the trip was obviously to be with family and our trip to Gettysburg was an added bonus. Although I am just now starting to get feeling back in my fingers from having the top down, the Miata, while

You can input your event of interest and a radius to search, and you'll come up with all the similar events in all the clubs that use MotorsportReg. This is a great option for folks looking for DE events at tracks throughout the east (and the rest of the US!) and for folks who just can't get enough autocross action.

The final spot to check is MotorsportReg's competitor, www.clubregistration.com. This is a similar system with lots of events by PCA regions, BMW car clubs and lots of other groups. Same idea as before, you can search different areas, tracks and types of events to find out what is going on and what you might be interested in.

With all these options out there, I'm sure you'll find some NCR events that you want to come out to this year. I hope to see you at some events — maybe even some of the great Tech events that are planned in the coming months. I know for me, it's a chance to get out of the house, put down the "to-do" list and have some fun with Porsche friends.

We have good dates for NHMS and I am very excited to let you know that we have two full days at Lime Rock this year.

Your DE Team has been putting in some overtime the last month preparing for the 2012 DE season. Even though the Car Control Clinic is not until May, we have had our planning meeting, presented our budget to the Board for approval and most importantly we have finalized our driving schedule for the year. As I mentioned last month, we have good dates for NHMS and I am very excited to let you know that we have two full days at Lime Rock this year. I'm not talking about one day for NCR which backs up to another day with another Region, I'm talking about two full days assigned to North Country! I don't think we have ever sponsored two days and from what I can tell, many of the other regions are sharing their events with the Lime Rock Drivers Club. The LRP event will be on September 19 and 20.

We are going to open for registration (motorsportreg.com) on February 1st. Solo drivers and instructors will be able to sign up for the entire year. John is going to stagger the Green and Yellow registrations again this year to allow for promotions. Green and Yellow drivers will be able to register for the early events on Feb 1st but will need to wait until June 1st to register for the September and October events. Look for the DE advertisement in this issue to update your personal calendar for registration and DE dates.

I need to let you know that we increased registration rates by \$5 per day to help offset additional costs for safety services. We absorbed the cost last year but with increased track rental fees this year we need to make a small increase. For the NHMS events, we plan to have two track dinners and a track party. Toni is organizing the activities so expect some great food and, as always, a great time swapping stories and enjoying the company of your fellow drivers.

We reviewed the recent revision to the Demonstration Rides (Standard #38) policy. The revision has no impact on the

instructor/student program but we will no longer offer the Taste of Track rides. The new guideline requires a separate Taste of Track run group which would take too much time from the other run groups. We also reviewed a draft policy dealing with cockpit secured devices e.g. video cameras or GPS devices. Look to the website for the information.

Before I end the column, I want to remind those of you thinking about trying DE in 2012, to consider attending NER's annual Drivers Education Ground School program. This is a great way to get information on why so many of us enjoy the Porsche Club Drivers Education program. The event will be held on **February 26th (Sunday)** at HMS Motorsports. Contact and sign-up information are contained in the advertisement in this issue of the *Northlander* or go to the NER website.

The second program that you should consider is the Car Control Clinic that we will sponsor on May 12th. This activity will take place in the lower parking lot at NHMS and involves real driving (in a controlled environment with a coach) in your very own car. You get to drive your car on a skid pad to find the adhesion limits of your car and then move to another area where you can work on threshold braking and rapid lane changes. Everyone who has participated in the previous CCC's have left with a slightly dirty car and a big smile on their face. It is a great way to begin your DE career.

BTW, we are going to need some experienced drivers to help coach the new drivers. You don't have to be an instructor to volunteer. Contact Dave Logan if you are interested.

OFF THE APEX by Jim Gratton, Vice President



Never before in the history of the Porsche Boxster was a change of generation so comprehensive. The open-top two-seater car is being marketed with a completely new lightweight body and a completely revamped chassis. Considerably lower weight, longer wheelbase, a wider track and larger wheels significantly enhance yet further the mid-engine sports car's driving dynamics, already far and away the best in its class, supported by the new electro-mechanical power steering. The new Boxsters boast superior performance and are also up to 15 per cent more fuel-efficient. Depending on model, they get by with significantly less than eight litres of fuel per 100 kilometres.

The new Boxster thus delivers what the fundamentally changed styling with shorter overhangs, significantly forward-shifted windscreen, flatter silhouette and expressive edges promises. The passengers are enclosed by the completely redesigned, fully electric hood, which now dispenses with a convertible top compartment lid. The interior concept offers the occupants more space and reflects the new Porsche outline with the raked centre console, which, originating with the Carrera GT, ensures further improved ergonomics in all models.

The new sports car generation makes its debut in the classic Porsche pairing of Boxster and Boxster S. Both models are powered by flat-six engines with direct petrol injection, the efficiency of which is further enhanced by electrical system recuperation, thermal management and start/stop function. The base model's new power unit delivers 265 hp (195 kW) from a 2.7 litre displacement – ten hp more than its larger displacement predecessor. Technically, it is now based on the 3.4-litre engine of the Boxster S. This now delivers 315 hp (232 kW), which is five hp more than before. 
