

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

"As soon as you know you can make the apex, put the hammer down" or something to that affect. – Scott Martineau – NCR DE instructor (Ed. I was hangin-on and driving my butt off.)

Musing #1

In last month's column I mentioned Maston Gregory, the Kansas City Flash. Yes, Kansas City! Not exactly a hot bed of sports car racing! He had terrible eyesight and wore thick horned rimmed glasses his whole life. In true racer fashion, he used a small inheritance (his father died when Maston was 3 years old) to buy a Mercury powered Allard when he was a teenager. A Hemi soon replaced the Merc. and he won the third SCCA event he entered. SCCA success led to an invitation to the 1000km in Buenos Aires and eventually to an F1 Maserati ride at Monaco in 1957 where he took third, the first American to podium in an F1 race. (you all thought that was Phil Hill, didn't you?) Although he raced in F1 thru 1965 he rarely completed a full season due to injuries sustained by his penchant for jumping out of moving cars that were about to crash. Something he did from an early age due to the inherent lack of crash protection in 1950s race cars. Gregory has the distinction of winning the first Nassau Speed Week event, the 1000km Nurburgring endurance race and Le Mans. He is also one of only a handful of drivers to race at Le Mans, Indy and in F1 at the time. He died in 1985 of a heart attack, in his sleep at age 53. Maston Gregory ranks right there with Phil Hill and Dan Gurney as the top American international drivers of that era.

Musing #2

Electric vehicles are becoming increasingly more viable as battery life, size and weight decrease. But the future may be super capacitors (Supercaps). Why? Because they degrade over time much slower than lithium ion batteries and have high power density so they discharge lots of energy quickly. But they have low energy density so they do not store much energy per unit, i.e. you need a lot of them. How is this being addressed you ask? By making a Supercap with electrolyte only one molecule thick, which means the Supercap can be very thin and flexible. Volvo has an experimental car where the Supercap is molded into the carbon fiber body shell, thus the body is the energy source. It is charged conventionally or by brake regeneration units and weight is cut 15%.

Musing #3

I was reading a car magazine the other day and an article on the Volkswagen Golf caught my eye as it compared the safety standards of the US version to the Euro version. Two differences which "struck" me: US airbags are designed to protect un-belted passengers and as such are actually less safe for belted passengers than the Euro equivalent. (Think about that the next time you click into your 3 point harness). The Euro version has a bigger hood bulge as well as less sturdy front bumpers to protect pedestrians if hit. US bumpers are built to sustain a 5 mph impact with solid objects; not to keep from injuring pedestrians.

Magnus results - Watkins Glen

Magnus brought in Seb Asch as a third driver for the 6 hour endurance race. He had just finished the 24hrs at the Nurburgring and had never been to WGI before. This was a full field race with 55 cars in four classes. Welcome to the Tudor series Seb!! Magnus qualified 5th in class (36th overall) which put them near turn 10 when the green flag dropped. Although John Potter had a stomach virus, he kept them competitive for the first 95 minutes. (unlike many teams which have their ace driver qualify and therefore start the race, Magnus has owner John Potter qualify and rely on the pro drivers and pit strategy to put the team in contention at the finish). Asch moved Magnus back to 5th during his double stint and then Andy Lally driving with a burnt and blistered right foot (an exhaust header broke on Continued on page 22

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


Judy Hendrickson LOOKING BACK



NCR's involvement in the Parade started two years ago when we volunteered to put on the Concours. We had assurances that John Paterek would be our Chief Judge, Ted Zombeck and Prescott Kelly would assemble the Historic Display cars and Northern New Jersey's team of Zone 1 Concours scorers using their MANUAL system (i.e. No Computers!) would do the scoring.

(The following excerpt is from the letter that accompanied the Heinmiller-winning submission of the **Northlander** for judging in the Newsletter Contest.)

Northlander had 74 feature articles from Region members during the year representing 23 separate contributors. That's roughly 10% of the membership! In addition, there were the regular monthly articles (always in the same location) from the President, Secretary, Membership Chairman, Editor and Region Technical Chairman. We also printed bi-annual Treasury reports. We reprinted 2 articles of special interest from other PCA Regions and used 7 press releases from outside the Region to promote Zone I's and other Region's events.



We all had a great time. Spirits were high, everyone enjoyed themselves.



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
