



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

The question was asked by a co-worker of mine... how many shopping days left until Christmas?



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

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## Judy Hendrickson LOOKING BACK



Picture 80-85 cars in two horse-shoe shaped lines facing the ocean at the Astor mansion. Planning was well underway for the Annual Banquet to be held at the Red Jacket Mountain Inn in North Conway, NH. Speakers were to be Zone 1 Rep John Boles and his wife Judy along with Bill & Diana Gowen, Parade Chairs for the 1986 Parade to be held in Portland, ME.

Steve Kaplan, the membership Chair, reported NCR was nearly 200 members and was the fastest growing region in Zone 1 and perhaps all of PCA. Our treasury was getting healthy as well, now boasting over \$4700 in hand. 
### The NCR Crew at Mt Tremblant

This issue covered news from PCA National, Porsche Cars North America, NCR members trip to Mt Tremblant, the upcoming Annual Banquet and Elections along with a look inside Edgar Broadhead's toolbox and a discourse on lug nuts. The Best in Show Award at PCA Parades (the Manhattan Trophy) was retired with the last one being presented at the 1995 Parade in Portland Oregon. The 1996 Parade in Grand Lake O' the Cherokees would see the inauguration of the Group Awards (Restoration. Preservation, and Preparation with both Full and Touring categories). PCNA announced to new additions to its 911 lineup – the Targa with its unique sliding glass roof and the Turbo look C4S. Prices for the various models was also announced with the base model C2 Coupe increasing nearly \$9,000 (\$63,750) over the 1995 model and the base price for the 911 Turbo Coupe now exceeded \$100,000 at \$105,000. Today's basic 911 starts at \$89,400 with a comparable Turbo at \$151,000. Profitability is clearly not a problem at Porsche these days. Jerry Austin's recount of his return to Mt Tremblant and shared experience with 16 other NCR members clearly showed the camaraderie of the region and why NCR was and is known as the good time region.

Once again there was an article recounting a member's experience at Mt Tremblant, this time by Jack Saunders. Assistant Editor, Tracey Levasseur, had a nice editorial recounting her past year's experience with NCR and also provided a "book review" on Porsche Boxster and Boxster S, by Clauspeter Becker, Jürgen Lewandowski and Herbert Volker. President Janet Leach summarized the Shrimp Boil Rally ending at the Frucci's lakeside home. David Churcher highlighted his experience with two shops that helped him with an interim refurbishment of his '84 Carrera seats and front-end paintwork. He would revisit this more extensively in 2015. David also graced us with a photomontage of the Toys for Tots Car Show hosted by Porsche of Nashua. Membership as of the end of August was now at 483.

## The Essex Resort and Spa with a Drive of the Islands of Lake Champlain and Surrounding Roads

## I Found a Modern Racing Hero! by Danielle Badler

Periodically, people chastise me for being an inveterate reader of The Wall Street Journal. It's owned by that evil manipulator of the night and the right, Rupert Murdoch, they say. It's biased, it's dull, and it's out of touch. It has nothing whatsoever, today, to do with what made the paper great.

And then I open it up to a profile titled "The Throwback Star of Formula One."

What? I mean, ok, but a profile of Lewis Hamilton? I didn't even think the Journal knew that he actually walks on this planet. What do I know.

This is what I know. It was a great read. And it made me rethink my view of Formula 1 "pilots" today. Or at least one of them.

You have to understand. Growing up, I was a big fan of Jim Clark. I have a framed photo of him, taken by Jesse Alexander. You know the one, where he's looking out into space, head slightly cocked.

As a kid, I read his bio. He took the author for a ride in his "daily driver," a Euro Ford Falcon, probably a "company" car. He screeched and scrawled all over the Scottish moors. Then he suddenly stopped the car, to say that one tire was down a few pounds of pressure. Which it was.

Clark seemed to be completely bewildered by his talent. Talent that led to abject disbelief when he bought the ranch in 1968. In a meaningless Formula 2 race. It just couldn't happen.

An example; he was asked how he can be so consistently faster than everyone else. And Clark simply answered, "I just brake a little later."

Yeah, and Babe Ruth just hit it a little farther. Sandy Koufax just threw it a little faster. Chuck Yeager just flew a little better.

Contrast to today. Driver coverage is so sanitary, they have a hard time fitting in the names of all their sponsors, when they go through the post-race "thank you" drill. You have no idea, as Chris Economaki would ask, what it's like out there.

So imagine my surprise when I read that, as a young cart racer, Hamilton's father found the spot where the fast kids braked, and urged his son to brake five yards farther.

He did... and he spun, and spun, and spun. But, eventually, "I became the latest braker."

Get this. He's quoted in the article saying "I don't like tiptronic, even though I race with tiptronic.... I like having a gear stick. I like three pedals. I like the heel-and-toe effect... you just have a little bit more control."

### I know!

Apparently Hamilton is infatuated with Senna. It makes sense. At his death, Hamilton was nine. Clark, on the other hand, died 17 years before he was born.

At this writing, he has 40 wins in 160 starts, to Senna's 41 wins in 161 starts. Any bets on whether he eclipses his idol?

Damon Hill, who raced alongside Senna at Williams, is quoted as saying, "Any era you like, he would thrive.... I think it's more difficult for him now because of the overengineering of the competition."

The article, however, points out that, sure, it's clear he has the fastest car out there... but so does Nico Rosberg. And Hamilton has out-qualified him in 11 of 12 races so far this season.

A few years ago, Hamilton test-drove Senna's world championship-winning McLaren MP4/4 from 1988. He matched Senna's pace almost exactly.

How? This is a great quote. "People come up to me and say, 'Oh, the way you took Turn 7, it's so much better than others.' I don't know if they really can see that. Because when I'm watching, I can't see the difference."

It is indeed that little bit later/faster/better. And it can't just be explained.

"I'm a real basic driver," Hamilton says. "There's drivers over time that close their eyes and envisage a lap and all that stuff. Maybe that works for them. For me it doesn't. Me, I drive. I drive the seat of the car."

Hooray. A real honest-to-goodness racing hero, in today's age. He exists!


